2007 Transportation Survey

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1. INTRODUCTION

The TREK Program Centre at the University of British Columbia provides a variety of transportation services to the UBC community, in support of goals to encourage sustainable travel. Every few years, TREK Program Centre staff undertake a survey of students, faculty, staff, residents and other employees on the Vancouver campus, to identify transportation needs and provide input to transportation plans. This report presents the results of the 2007 Transportation Survey, which was undertaken in March 2007.

1.1. Survey Method

The 2007 Transportation Survey was conducted via the Internet. The survey was hosted by Infopoll, a company in Nova Scotia providing online survey and reporting capabilities. The survey was advertised through an e-mail broadcast to all persons on the Vancouver campus, and through a link from the TREK Program Centre website. Participation in the survey was encouraged by offering four \$150 prizes to randomly-selected respondents.

The online survey was pre-tested by a small number of UBC staff and UBC's transportation consultant. The e-mail broadcast advertising the survey occurred on the morning of Friday, 2 March 2007. The published deadline for participating in the survey was Friday, 16 March, but responses up to Friday, 23 March were included.

A significant problem occurred on the first day of the survey. Within an hour following the e-mail broadcast, the online questionnaire was not available. The problem appears to have been caused by the large number of people attempting to access the survey, and as a result overloading the Infopoll server. The survey remained unavailable for much of the first day. In response, a notice was added to the TREK Program Centre website advising respondents of the technical difficulties, and asking that they return on Monday the following week to complete the survey.

As a result of these technical difficulties, the response rate for the 2007 Transportation Survey was barely half the response rate for the two previous Transportation Surveys (both of which were also conducted online, but using a different company to host the survey). Table 1.1 provides a comparison of response rates to recent Transportation Surveys.

1.2. Analysis of Results

Responses to the 2007 Transportation Survey were downloaded and aggregated into a spreadsheet, which was used for subsequent analysis as well as review of comments. Results were also tabulated using Infopoll's online reporting tools. Detailed tabulated results are contained in the appendices.

It is important to recognize that the data presented in this report represent simple tabulations of the responses. The survey results have not been weighted to reflect the campus population or any other demographic or transportation characteristics, to avoid introducing any unintended biases to the results. Because the survey "sample" (the group of persons who responded to the survey) is self-selected rather than randomly-selected, there is an inherent element of bias in the results. The potential risk in weighting or otherwise adjusting the results is that this could exaggerate any inherent biases. Consequently, the results are presented "as is," and it is left to those using the information to determine its significance.

2. DEMOGRAPHICS

This section highlights key demographic characteristics of the UBC population. More detail is provided in the appendices, which contain tabulations of all survey questions.

Table 2.1 provides a summary of reasons respondents gave for being at UBC. The majority of respondents were students — 56.9% of respondents indicated that being a student was their primary reason for being at UBC, and a further 4.8% of respondents indicated that being a student was a secondary reason for being at UBC. Staff accounted for much of the remaining responses — 30.9% as a primary reason, and an additional 5.2% as a secondary reason.

Table 2.2 provides a comparison of numbers of survey responses with actual numbers of students, staff and faculty. This comparison indicates that students are under-represented in the survey results — although students account for 81.6% of the campus population, they only account for 58.4% of survey responses from within this same population. Faculty and staff are over-represented by similar proportions.

Table 2.3 provides a summary of where respondents live. One in six respondents live on campus. Among those who live off-campus, almost two-thirds (62.2%) live in Vancouver. Among students, faculty and staff who live off-campus, 60.0%, 73.7% and 62.5% live in Vancouver, respectively.



Figure 2.4 provides a summary of reasons respondents gave for choosing where to live. The cost of accommodation and the neighbourhood were the most commonly-cited reasons. Of particular significance is that proximity to UBC was not as important a consideration for staff and non-UBC employees.

A total of 85 respondents indicated that they have disabilities or special needs that make using available transportation services difficult, representing 2.7% of persons who answered the specific question. Among those who indicated the type of disabilities or special needs, 51% indicated mobility impairments, 6% indicated visual impairments, and 1% indicated hearing impairments. Half the respondents indicated "other" disabilities or special needs, including chronic illnesses, environmental allergies, arthritis, balance problems, and mental illnesses. Eleven persons indicated child care needs and challenges travelling with children

3. MODE CHOICES

This section describes the reported mode shares for trips to and from UBC, as well as to other destinations. More detail is provided in the appendices, which contain tabulations of all survey questions.




Figure 3.1 — Reported numbers of trips to and from UBC, Monday through Friday

Tables 3.1 and 3.2 provide a summary of reported numbers of trips to and from UBC by various modes, for the five days from Monday through Friday (Table 3.1) and the weekend (Table 3.2). Figure 3.1 illustrates the data in Table 3.1. Significant results include:

- The highest level of transit use occurs among students (most of whom have U-Passes), while the lowest levels of reported transit use occur among residents and faculty.
- Faculty report the highest level of bicycle use.
- Residents and non-UBC employees report the highest levels of drive-alone travel.




Figure 3.2 — Average weekday trips per person to and from UBC — reported vs. actual

Table 3.3 and Figure 3.2 compare numbers of trips to and from UBC reported in the 2007 Transportation Survey with numbers of trips observed in Fall 2006. Although the total numbers of trips per day are similar (1.81 reported trips per weekday *vs.* 1.90 observed trips per weekday), survey respondents over-reported "green" modes of travel such as transit, cycling and walking, and under-reported automobile modes of travel (driving alone, carpooling and vanpooling).

Table 3.4 summarizes responses to questions about automobile ownership and use. Two-thirds of respondents own a car or have access to a car, and 37% of these persons drive to UBC.

Table 3.5 and Figure 3.3 summarize reported travel times for persons who commute to UBC. It is important to recognize that these are reported times, and as a result may vary from actual average travel times. Nevertheless, they are useful in providing a comparison between travel times for different groups. Average travel times for students, faculty, staff and non-UBC employees are 45 minutes, 25 minutes, 40 minutes and 35 minutes, respectively.

Figure 3.3 — Reported travel times to UBC




Table 3.6 summarizes responses to the question "over the past year, has your use of the Internet for education and research purposes reduced how much you travel to and from UBC?" Overall, 26% of persons who provided an answer to the question indicated that their use of the Internet has reduced travel to and from UBC.

4. TRANSIT

More persons travel to and from UBC by transit than by any other mode. Because transit is such an important mode of travel, many of the questions on the 2007 Transportation Survey related to transit services. This section highlights responses to these questions. More detail is provided in the appendices, which contain tabulations of all survey questions.

Table 4.1 and Figure 4.1 provide a summary of transit use. A total of 88% of respondents have used transit to travel to and from UBC since the academic year began in September 2006. More than half of these persons use transit every day.

Figure 4.1 — Use of transit






Figure 4.2 — Reported numbers of transit trips in the past seven days

Table 4.2 and Figure 4.2 provide a summary of reported transit trips during the past seven days, to *all* destinations (not just to and from the Vancouver campus). As noted in Section 3, transit trips are over-reported on the Transportation Survey. Consequently, the figures in Table 4.2 and Figure 4.2 should not be considered accurate counts of transit trips. They are useful, however, in providing a comparison of transit use for various trip purposes.




Figure 4.3— Bus routes used for trips to/from UBC

Figure 4.3 illustrates the reported use of different bus routes for trips to and from UBC, as well as the percentage of all transit trips on each route (from Fall 2006 transit ridership data). It is important to note that the brown bars in Figure 4.3 simply indicate the relative use or popularity of each bus route, not the relative numbers of trips respondents. Although Route 17 is second in use or popularity, for example, the actual number of trips on Route 17 is lower than on several other routes, indicating that persons who reported using Route 17 use this route less frequently than persons who use other routes.

Table 4.3 and Figure 4.4 provide a summary of satisfaction levels with various aspects of regional transit services. The U-Pass program enjoys very high levels of satisfaction, even among non-students! The lowest levels of satisfaction for regional transit services are for crowding on buses, evening and weekend service, frequencies of service, and travel time by bus. For community shuttle services, the lowest levels of satisfaction are for frequency of service and hours of service.

Figure 4.4 — Satisfaction with regional transit services (5 = very satisfied, 3 = neutral, 1 = very dissatisfied






Table 4.4 provides a summary of community shuttle use. Although almost two-thirds of respondents were aware of the community shuttle service, of those only 18% (a total of 370 respondents) had used the service. The majority of people who had used the service had done so only a small number of times — less than once per month.

Figure 4.5 provides a summary of the ratings of various incentives to encourage transit use. Although it is the most popular incentive among students, a U-Pass program was not rated as highly by staff, faculty and residents. Instead, these groups prefer incentives which improve the quality of transit service, such as more frequent, faster and reliable service, fewer transfers, and less crowded buses.




Figure 4.6 — Reasons why don't use transit any more

A total of 150 persons indicated that although they have used transit since September 2006, they do not use transit any more (these 150 persons represent 4.8% of all persons who had used transit since September 2006). Figure 4.6 provides a summary of reasons why respondents do not use transit any more. The second and third most-common reasons — crowded buses and pass-ups — relate to the effects of increased ridership as a result of the student U-Pass. This result is consistent with input previously received by UBC from several staff and faculty members who have indicated that they no longer use transit for these reasons.

Table 4.5 indicates the levels of support among staff, faculty and residents for voluntary U-Pass programs. While there is strong support among staff and faculty for a U-Pass program priced at \$35 to \$45 per month, but there is considerably less support for combining a U-Pass program with a parking permit which would allow staff and faculty to drive some days and take transit other days.

5. CYCLING

This section highlights responses to questions regarding bicycle facilities on campus. More detail is provided in the appendices, which contain tabulations of all survey questions.

Twenty-three percent of respondents indicated that they ride a bicycle to UBC or on campus. Twenty-one percent of respondents indicated that access to a secure bike cage or a bike locker would encourage them to cycle to UBC more often than they do currently.

Table 5.1 provides a summary of responses regarding potential use of secure bicycle parking facilities. It is important to note that in the Transportation Survey, bike cages and bike lockers were described as "free to use," whereas a centrally-located secure bicycle parking facility was described as costing \$1 per day to use.

Locations on campus where respondents requested more bike racks, bike cages and bike lockers are tabulated in the appendices. The most requested location for more bike racks, bike cages and lockers was the bus loop. Other key locations include parkades, the Student union Building, Brock hall, Buchanan, the Koerner library, Forestry, Scarfe and AERL.

6. PARKING

This section provides a summary of responses to key questions regarding parking. More detail is provided in the appendices, which contain tabulations of all survey questions.

Table 6.1 provides a summary of the reported frequency of driving to UBC and parking on or near the campus. Almost half the respondents who drive to campus do so five days a week, while more than one quarter of respondents who drive do so only one day a week.




Figure 6.1 — Methods of payment for parking on campus

Figure 6.1 provides a summary of methods of payment for parking. Permits are the most common method of paying for parking, particularly among staff. Students are most likely to pay for parking on a daily or hourly basis.

Table 6.2 indicates satisfaction levels with parking services on campus. Overall, students are less satisfied with parking than faculty, staff and other employees, who indicated similar levels of satisfaction. Also noteworthy is that residents reported a significantly lower satisfaction with flexibility of parking payment.

A total of 73 respondents indicated that they park off-campus in Vancouver and the UEL. As Table 6.2 indicates, this means that approximately 2.0% of the campus population — as many as 1,100 persons — might park off-campus. Table 6.3 identifies off-campus locations where respondents reported parking.




