Transportation Hardship Fund (THF) UBC O U-Pass Program

The Transportation Hardship Fund (THF) fund is an annual fund per year that will be used to provide subsidies off the cost of the U-Pass to UBC O students who are not eligible to apply for an exemption but who have other circumstances limiting their ability to benefit from the U-Pass program or who suffer financial hardship due to the mandatory nature of the U-Pass program.

The Fund is administered through the Associate Vice President Administration and Finance, Parking Office. Please read the following information before completing your application.

Eligibility Criteria

Applicants must meet one or more of the following criteria in order to apply for the THF:

- 1. Demonstration of financial hardship (requires proof of private or student loan).
- 2. Family obligations (e.g. single parent, sick parents, medical need, etc.) that limit student's ability to attend campus on a regular and consistent basis.
- 3. Live in area within the Central Okanagan Regional District where transit service is limited or not currently available. Applications received under this criterion will be assessed by the City of Kelowna (requires proof of residence via bill or piece of recent mail dated no more than 2 months prior to the date of your THF application).

Administering the THF

Depending on the number of applications received, a sliding scale may be used to determine the level of subsidy that you will receive.

THF Application Deadline

The attached application form and supporting documentation must be received by **September 30th**. Students starting courses in January, who wish to apply for the STI Fund, must do so by **January 31st**.

Submitting your Application

All subsidy applications must be received by the deadline in order to be considered. Applications can be dropped off, sent in campus mail, or emailed to the following address:

Receiving your Subsidy

You will be notified via email if your subsidy application has been accepted and how much of a subsidy you will receive by October 31st for the Fall semester and February 28th for the Winter semester. Successful applicants will receive a credit to their financial account for the subsidy amount they have been granted.
